One officer and four soldiers were wounded by cluster bombs.</p> <p>The relocation of units to the axis of engagement began at 1100 hours. By 1300 hours, the remaining ŠTS in the sectors of the north part of the Kraljane village and Reč-Mahala. At 1345 hours, we continued the attack along the axes Šaban Mahala – tt 544 (Čukare), Reč-Mahala – tt 544 and Kraljane – tt 483 (/word illegible/). With a well-organised firing system, the ŠTS offered most resistance to our forces along the line tt 544 – tt 483. By 1800 hours, our forces took control of the said features and took over the said positions, where they will spend the night. During the operations, losses were inflicted on the ŠTS, 11 of whom were killed, while other losses were not recorded, but were probably serious.
